

I am very proud of the St. Mary tradition and the dedication it has taken to keep the spirit alive on Chestnut Street. I personally donate to our high school with many other alumni to keep that tradition functioning at such a high quality of education.

My mother, who passed in 2016 at 100 years of age, (class of 1933) told me the history of how the high school began. Back in the Autumn of 1929, eleven students who graduated from St. Mary Grammar School had the option to attend public high school or to continue with a catholic high school education. These eleven students took the bus and attended St. John's High School, Paterson, NJ. After approximately a month or two of commuting, they approached the Pastor of St. Mary's, Father Tischler, and asked him to request the Archdiocese of Paterson for their own high school. Father Tischler was successful. These eleven freshmen attended classes in the old grammar school and were rewarded by having the high school completed by the beginning of their senior year. During my mother's lifetime, she was able to see 82 classes graduate from St. Mary High School.

These eleven students and all our fellow alumnus built a future for over 9,000 graduates. I truly owe it to them and to all our alumni, as well as our present-day students, to keep St. Mary High School open and flourishing. Offering teachers and students newer materials, software, and programs to use throughout the school day will not only enhance the education we provide, but also increase our competitiveness with other local schools.

I will be meeting with all the teachers over the next month to talk about course offerings in their departments. All staff will work on improving instruction by using the Charlotte Danielson model. Q&A WITH PRINCIPAL VITERITTI

Frank Viteritti has over two decades of experience in public and Catholic education. His most recent position was as Associate Superintendent for Teacher Personnel for the Archdiocese of New York, where he shared oversight of over 100 archdiocesan schools. Prior to his work with the Archdiocese of New York, Mr. Viteritti was principal of St. Eugene School in Yonkers, NY, West Hempstead High School in West Hempstead, NY, and Westlake High School in Thornwood, NY. His work with developing academic and extracurricular programs for students, as well as professional development for administrators and faculties, has defined his career in education. Mr. Viteritti earned his B.A. in History with a minor in Education, his M.S. Ed. in Secondary Social Studies/Education, and his Professional Diploma in Education Administration from Iona College.

What motivated you to come to SMHS?

After doing research about St Mary HS, the reasons why I wanted to come here are the following I liked that St Mary is a small school which will allow me to get to know all the students and their parents. When I interviewed here, the questions I was being asked about instruction and enrollment aligned with what I believe in and I felt that as the new leader I would be able to make a difference and hopefully attract more students to come here.

How is the school handling the challenges of the pandemic?

Finally, maintaining the school building inside and out; how the building looks is the first impressions for parents, community members and students.

Where do you see SM in 2 years ... in 5 years?

Long term goals for St Mary HS. First it's to increase enrollment. We need to revamp our curriculum, so it meets the needs of the 21sr century learner, especially when it comes to the electives that we offer. Along with that, use of technology and updating and increasing our technology is a must. Looking into our AP program and evaluating what we offer for our AP Program. Continue to improve our sports and co-curricular programs. Example: most schools for drama have a school play in the fall which is a Drama and do a musical in the spring. At present time we are doing a musical. The goal for next year will be to do both. As mentioned in the short-term goals. We need to add to our sports program so we can attract more students. Sports like golf boys volleyball and girls lacrosse are something we are looking into.

Which is why it is extremely important to my wife Lisa and me to find ways to help parents who want to create the best possible future for their children; who want to be confident and supportive of the curricula that is being taught to their children; and who want to be sure that regardless of race, background, religion or any other aspect of that which makes us great, their children will be exposed to an environment of learning as a priority, respect for one another as individuals, and teamwork. This is what I remember about St. Mary and why Lisa and I are so supportive of its mission. If you are reading this, very likely you had a similar experience.
