ENROLLMENT AND PARTICIPATION ON THE RISE AT SMHS

When you evaluate the future of any school or business, growth is always a good sign that it has a bright future. SMHS has increased its total enrollment by 18 students for the 2022-2023 school year. The incoming freshmen class is currently at 57, which is an average increase of 8 students more than the previous

3 classes. Now more than ever, small, personal and catholic, in a co-education environment, is an attractive and desperately needed option for many parents. The numbers don't lie!

How about this for an increase? The proud & successful football tradition at SMHS goes back to 1932 when in its first season the Gaels put 13 players on a bus with one coach and a priest and knocked off the powerful St. Cecilia team of Englewood 7-6. Although still competitive, last year's participation had dropped to a concerning number of 19 players. Since the hiring of Alumni Paul Johnsen '98, the program has grown to 38 players fielding both varsity and sub-varsity squads.

Under the leadership of 2nd year Principal Frank Viteritti, new curriculum has been added. New clubs such as Gaming have been created. The once 4-time state championship sport of wrestling is back along with the first ever co-ed golf team. The girls volleyball team had a tremendous season winning the league title and qualifying for the state tournament with a record of 20-4.

64 Chestnut is alive and buzzing with excitement. Now we need the alumni's help. Street named in honor of hero Joseph J. Rybka, Jr. '64

In May 2009, the St. Mary High School Alumni Department recognized Officer Joseph Rybka, Jr. as one of its distinguished alumni of the year. On September 22, along with the Bergen County Sheriff's Office and the Borough of Rutherford, St. Mary High School dedicated an engraved memorial stone at the entrance of our school, his alma mater, to forever recognize Joseph Rybka for his service and his ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty. The Borough of Rutherford also remembered Joe's sacrifice by renaming the corner of Ames Avenue and Chestnut Street in memory of Deputy Rybka.

Sheriff's Deputy Joseph J. Rybka, Jr., was a member of the St. Mary High School Class of 1964. He was shot and killed in the line of duty on January 7, 1979 by a wounded prisoner he was guarding at Bergen Pines County Hospital. He was 32 years old, and left behind his parents, wife Patricia, and a six-year old son Eric.

Joe had served with the Bergen County Sheriff's Office for 10 years and was assigned to Courthouse Security.

Joe grew up in Rutherford, and was a gifted baseball player who dreamt of a career as a major league pitcher. He went on to Fairleigh Dickinson University. He met his wife Patricia while working for Lightolier in Passaic, and were married at the Church of St. Mary in 1970. Joe joined the Bergen County Sheriff's Office in 1969. He served as an ombudsman and advocate for inmates, and watched over some of the most violent criminals in Bergen County.

DIRECTOR OF ADMISSIONS



Since early September, students have been asking me how the new job is going, and my answer is always great! I promote open houses and encourage attendance for parents and students to get a firsthand look at the Saint Mary campus, meet our faculty, and speak with our student ambassadors. My office also oversees the *Gael for a Day* program where potential students shadow current students throughout a typical school day.

The next few months, we will be actively recruiting candidates who have taken the HSPT entrance exam and express sincere interest in attending Catholic high school. We aim to attract the best and brightest graduating 8th graders to join the SMHS Class of 2027! We also are very busy with students who are potential transfer students in upper grade levels.

I really am excited to be here and be a part of this community and continue to keep building this fantastic school to new heights!

Project Forward is a program for Saint Mary students to earn college credits and experience a collegiate course of study during their high school careers. The program, which was established in 2019, is extremely popular with our highest achieving students. SM juniors and seniors enroll and attend classes at Felician College here in Rutherford. Students choose from a select course list to study each semester and earn 3 to 4 college credits depending on the class completed. These credits are transferable to different universities around the country.

The program allows students to study a subject extensively and actively participate in the in-person classes. Working with professors and handling the requirements of a college level class is a priceless experience in their preparation for university studies. The courses develop a myriad of skills that can be applied to many different areas of study. The courses also give a first-hand glimpse into different majors which may help the students choose a path of study upon graduation.

With that being said, each of our players have demonstrated their own individual skills throughout the year, which in simplest terms, have led us to our position today.

The Gaels enter their first state tournament game this Tuesday, November 1st at 4:15PM at their new home court. The team plans to continue their positive season going & look to bring the school their first state title in Volleyball. After completing the season undefeated in league play and capturing the league title this year, St. Mary's has most definitely been put on the map for future Volleyball prospects. FOOTBALL ON THE RISE

The St. Mary football program is on the rise!! While there was some cause for concern with covid hitting and bringing the number of athletes coming out for football down, it is now time to get excited about the future. Last season there were 17 football players when the new coaching staff arrived. With continued persistence in attracting students in the school to play, we finished the season with 23 players. The 2022 season now has 38 players on the roster with only 3 seniors graduating, 8 Juniors, 12 Sophomore and 15 Freshman. Next year the varsity team will be back at full strength. The 2022 team was even able to field a JV team, which is very exciting to get all of our athletes competitive action against other teams. The foundation of the program has been built, through discipline, hard work and a family atmosphere. We will continue to build off that through the off-season in the weight room and competing in other sports. The vision of the school and coaching staff is to make St. Mary the gold standard of high school football. We will do this by competing at the highest level and doing it the right way. We will emphasize to our kids that being a good student, sibling, son or daughter are the priorities for our program. We use football as a tool to teach kids about life and committing to the process through a teamwork. Football is more than a game and wins and losses, it's an experience of hard work and building relationships.

If you previously went to, currently go to, or at the very least have been to our beloved St. Mary's school, you know our gymnasium. While this gym has given us all that we need to practice, (the good and the bad), it has also enabled us to be one of the most consistent "road warrior" teams our league has ever seen for years.

The 2022 Gaels Volleyball team already had their eyes set on improving from a breakout season in 2021. This year, our "road warrior" team finally had the opportunity to host a few home matches this year, all thanks to Felician University. This new home allowed us to host 4 regular season games, more than we've ever seen before, which helped us to reach our incredible 21-3 regular season. A season which saw a major league realignment, in an even more competitive league, at that.

SOCCER NUMBERS UP

Over the past two years the St Mary Soccer Program has seen its roster grow in numbers, secure victories on the field, and change the opponent's perception about Gaels Soccer! Brian Smith played for Jack Jones at Clifton High School. Brian honed his coaching skills under Coach Jones at Pope Paul IV High School, and then came to St. Mary High with Jones to St. Mary in 1989. The Gaels quickly became perennial champions throughout the 90s, the winningest decade of the school's illustrious football history. Together with last year's Jack Jones winner, Jack Purcell, they coached the offensive line and perfected the feared Gael Sweep.

90 Years of Gaels Football

The 90 years of football celebration drew hundreds of alumni, former players and coaches back to their alma mater. Pregame, Mayor Frank Nunziato and councilman Mark Golsack presented a proclamation to Principal Frank Viteritti declaring the day St. Mary HS Football Day in the Borough of Rutherford.

At halftime of a fiercely fought game between the Gaels and the Boilmarkers of Garfield H.S. family members of the first SM Gaels of 1932 were recognized and presented with a photo of that team. Former players and coaches were then called out to the field by their respected decade of participation led by Jerry Breslin and Jerry Frain graduates of the class of 1955 and members of the Back to Back State Championship teams of 1953 and 1954.

The proud tradition of St. Mary high school football was on full display for current players, coaches, students and families to see and feel.

After graduating with her doctorate in January 2014, Dr. Larmore was accepted into the Mt. Sinai Medical Center's Clinical Molecular Genetics Laboratory Fellowship Program. After completing a two-year fellowship, Dr. Larmore became board certified by The American Board of Medical Genetics and Genomics in 2019. She currently works as an Associate Director of the Molecular Genetics Testing Laboratory at Sema4, where she oversees the genetic testing of couples interested in learning their reproductive risk for inherited genetic disorders.

- **Bequests:** A gift through a will can help St. Mary's meet these needs for the future.
- **Alumni Memorial Fund:** Contributions to this fund are used for student financial aid.
